A New Command: Safe Church Sunday

Talk summary:

God prepares His people by giving them a new commandment – to love one another as He has loved them

Key Verse: John 13 31-35:

(Proverbs 31 8,9; Ephesians 5 8-13; Isaiah 53 6)

Key points:

- 1. God wants our Church communities to display a love that is respectful of others, where all can feel safe, and where all can belong
- 2. Protecting others is at the heart of the Christian community. God calls us to stand up for the vulnerable.
- 3. The light of Christ will shine on the darkness and expose wrongdoing. Changing attitudes mean that more of what has been hidden in terms of abuse is being exposed and this is a positive thing.
- 4. In a fallen world, we are learning more about what we can do to protect people from being mistreated and a series of safeguarding practices have been developed.
- 5. We should see safeguarding as the practical outworking of Scripture and an expression of our love for one another.
