

Well, how do I sum up all that's happened this term? It's been incredibly busy, and we've seen change we weren't expecting. New initiatives have launched, and old ones have remained strong. We've made new friends, opened doors that were previously closed, and witnessed God moving in ways that have simply astonished us!

In terms of simple numbers, this term we have delivered -

Primary

We were able to deliver our annual series of workshops at Cheam High and Oaks park about choices around Knife Crime and County Lines. This became particularly poignant as the tragic murder of the young girl in Croydon occurred whilst we were in Oaks Park, and this had a dramatic impact on the degree to which the pupils responded.

Our already strong relationship with Cheam High has developed even further. In September they allowed us to start a prayer group for students every Monday morning at 8.20am, and they provided us with a suitable room. We've seen a consistent number of Christian youngsters attend, and we have a real sense that God is moving in this particular school.





And we've delivered all those assemblies too! Our amazing team of enthusiastic volunteers never cease to astound us with their determination to let children know about God and His story. Every time we arrive at any school, we are greeted by smiling children who remember our last one, and are delighted to welcome us back. Oh that this joy will translate into personal faith!

Charis has delivered 27 RE days, which has enabled her to communicate personal faith in an educational environment, letting the children know that following Jesus is very relevant and just as appropriate today as at any time in history.

We enjoy the result of the outstanding work of so many people who have come before us, and the reputation of Sutton Schoolswork remains incredibly strong, and we are in the privileged position of being welcomed in all our regular schools. They all seem delighted to allow us to proclaim His name in everything we do, He is mentioned in every one of our activities, and, especially in the primary schools, staff are more than happy to let us tell their charges that we believe Jesus is the Light of the World.
