This has indeed been a hard newsletter to write! Thomas's dad passed away on the 17th of October. The weeks before and the weeks after his passing have been a blur of grief, digging into family, and sharing our son around for snuggles as he begins to giggle and babble.

All this time I have been thinking a lot about the goodness of Jesus. He takes this traumatic, unspeakably horrifying process of dying and turns it into a doorway. It is still harder than words can say, still overwhelming and terrible but the `sting` of death is removed. The finality of it all is changed. The promise of eternal life meets our deepest need, a need that many of us spend our lives ignoring.

During Jesus' ministry, people are going about their lives, wanting freedom from Rome or food or just water from a well. Jesus keeps redirecting them to the thing they keep ignoring, which on their deathbed, will suddenly be the most need of their lives. He tells them that daily food isn't as needful as "the bread of life" and that water which temporarily satisfies thirst is nothing compared to the "living water." Jesus shows His people that freedom from the oppression of Rome is not nearly as needful as deliverance from sin and death.

Don't ignore the deepest need of your life.

"For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Corinthians 15:53-57 ESV
